They stepped onto that ship knowing it would be their only home. They'd never see another.


Did they miss having men in their lives? Were some of them relieved?

Only the order of birth was left to their discretion.




The utopian ideal of direct democracy was abandoned when it became clear that certain women were better suited to lead than others.
