AN ISOLATED ISLAND.



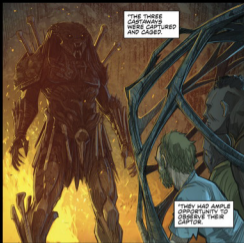
ISOLATED, BUT NOT

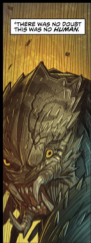
