I'm serious. This doesn't normally happen to me.

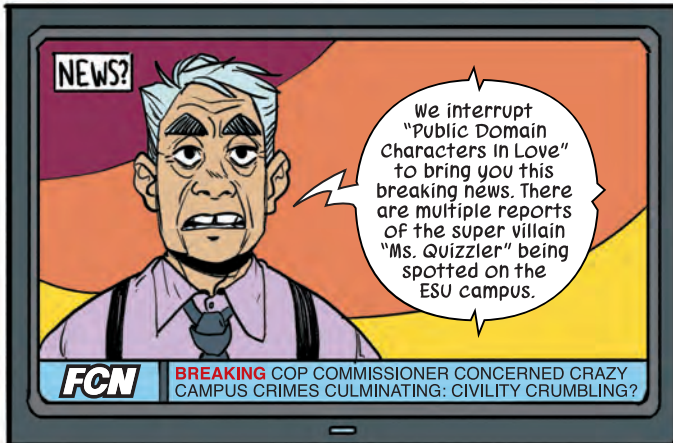
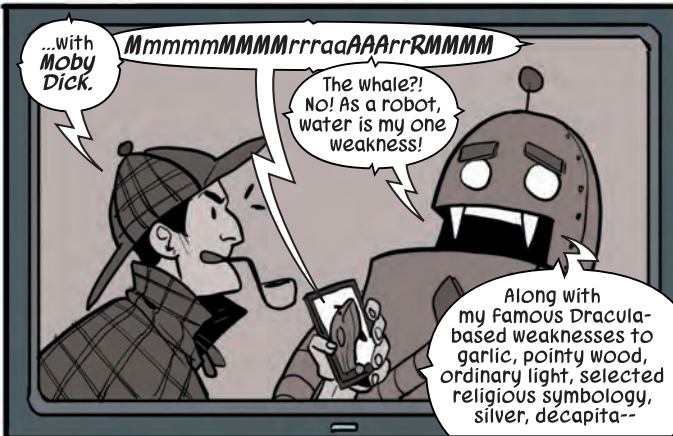
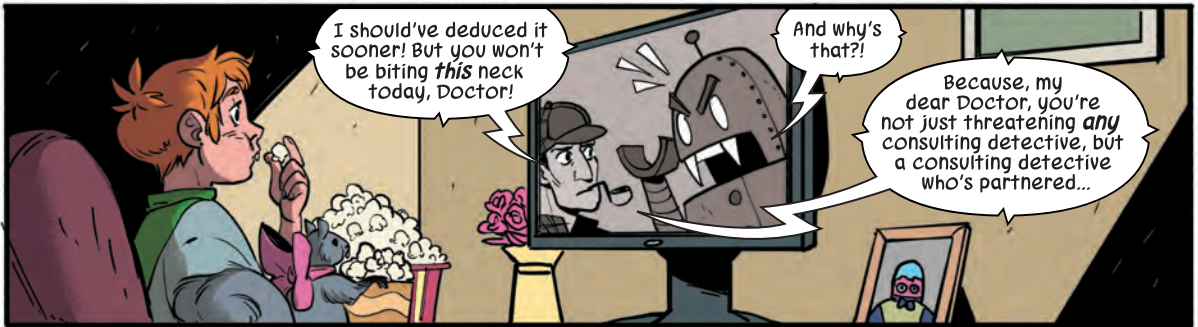
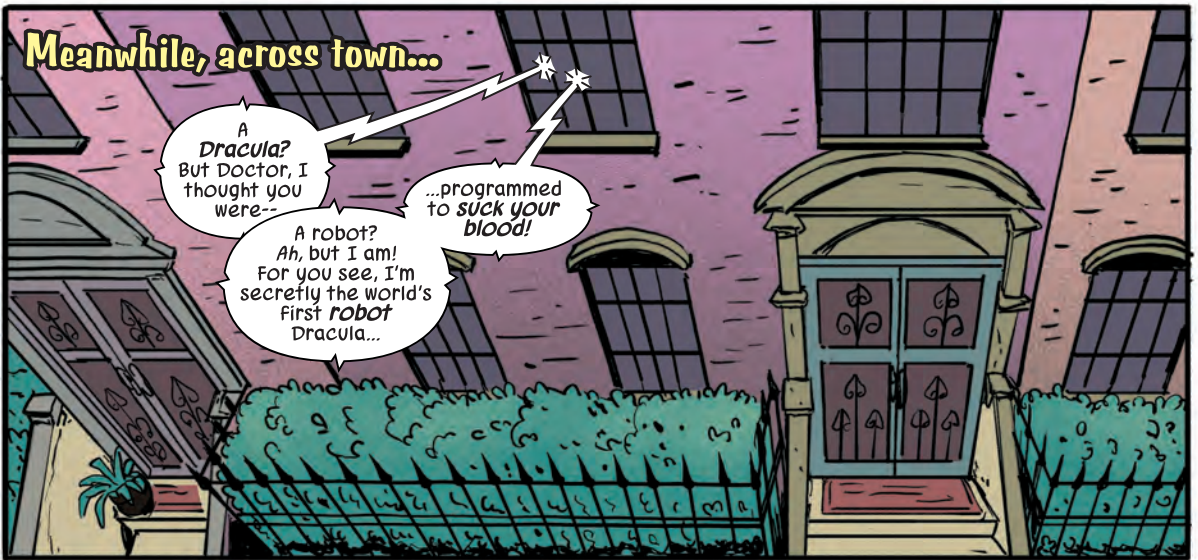
Getting captured by a super villain? Really? I've done this a couple times, actually. Heck, Tony Stark was doing this just last week.*

FAMOUS QUOTE: "Are you going to finish that?"



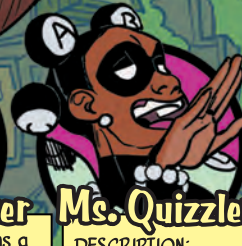
Nancy Whitehead
