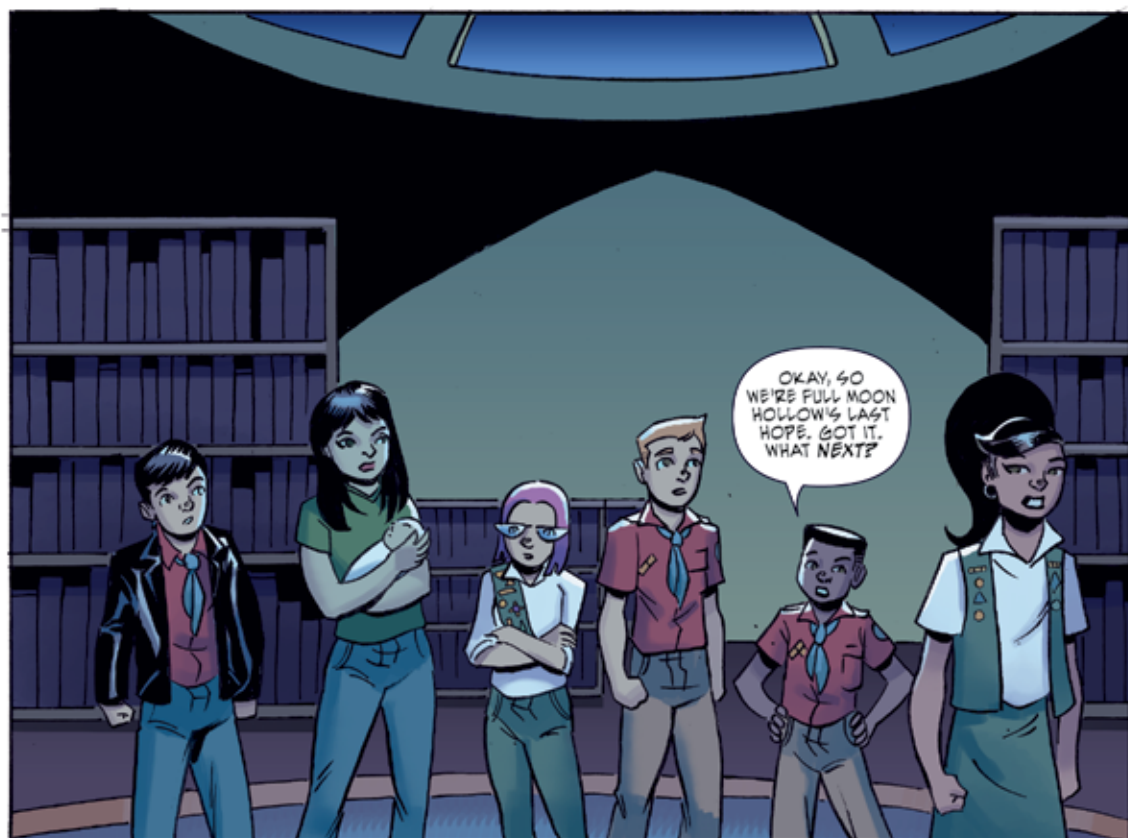

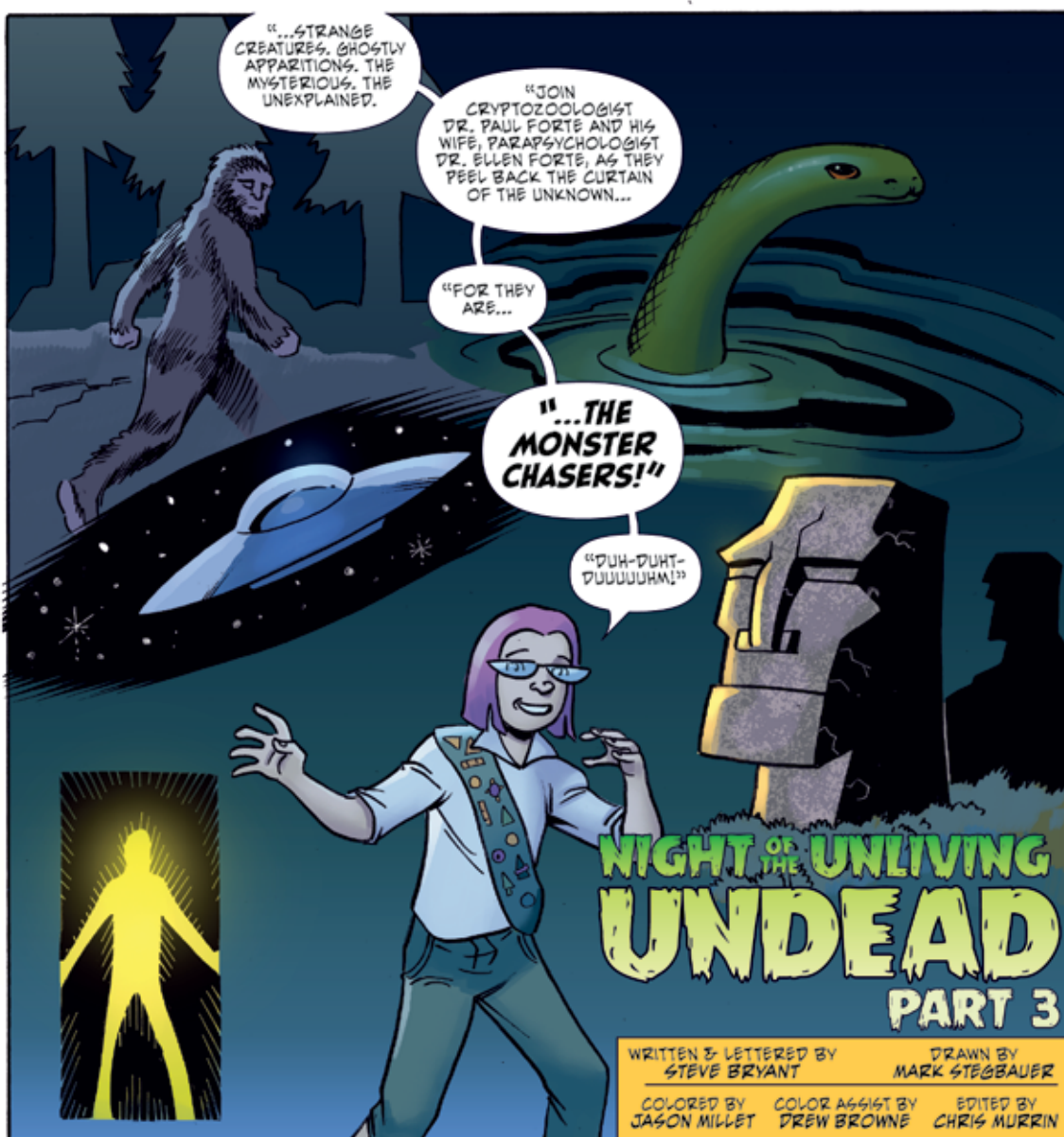

# "HORROR HOUSE" DEFIES DEMOLITION

The historic Phillips house has survived multiple changes of ownership, World Wars, and now it's torn down—after thirteen attempts.

Built in 1865 by local author Howard Phillips, the mansion that bears his name has dominated the eastern skyline of Full Moon Hollow. In recent years, the house has fallen into disrepair and was finally scheduled to be torn down last April. In the time since the building was condemned, mechanical failures have postponed demolition.

their decision to demolish the historic landmark. This development is only the most recent unexplained occurrence associated with the house since its construction.

After Phillips' son's death in 1957, the building was sold to renowned surgeon Hannibal Mason, who was later arrested after charges of patient abuse surfaced. Mason had no heirs, and upon his incarceration in 1966, authorities discovered the extent of his experiments

formed in his home. "Mad Scientist Mason's House," as it had become known, was reopened in 1970 as The Pleasantville Home for the Criminally Insane. Reports of employee misconduct and patient mistreatment caused the Home to close its doors in 1975.

While it has remained unoccupied ever since, the house has been at the center of numerous unexplained phenomena, and has been featured on the television show *Monster Chasers* on ten occasions.

## MONSTROUS HERO MAKES Sittyville's guardian spotted in Full Moon Hollow

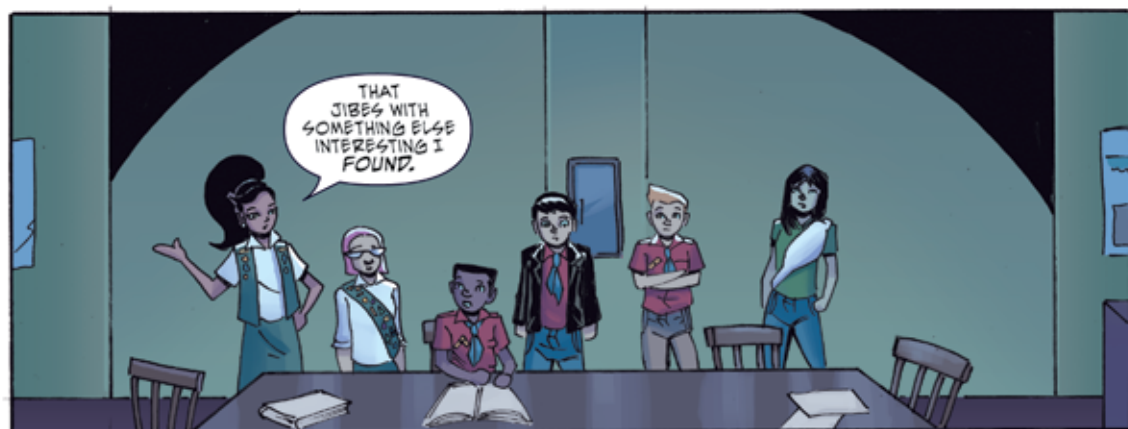
This marks the second time that the paranormal investigator has been sighted in and around Full Moon Hollow. He was also seen at the 2014 Hemlock County Fair last month.
